I cannot imagine what summer there will bring. I was blessed to be with Heather and Bill when Jacob called last Saturday night and I got to talk to him for just a minute, too. He told us he is happy doing what he is doing. This is what he's always wanted to do and this is what he has trained for several years now. He told us it is an honor for him to serve his country and he is proud to be able to do that for all of us.

I now think about and pray for our soldiers every day; they are always on my mind. What made the difference? I always have felt I was patriotic. Then I realized it was the personal relationship I have with one particular soldier, my grandson. He, along with my other 6 grandchildren, are some of my greatest blessings.

Then I remembered how my Christian life was before I met a wonderful Christian lady, Donna Brenner. Up until that time I went to church nearly

You see, I sleep in a box up around the corner there and down the alley and its awful cold in there for tonight. Sure would be nice to have a warm place to stay."

The policeman looked down at the little boy and said, "You go down the street to that big white house and you knock on the door. When they come out the door you just say John 3:16 and they will let you in."

I immediately stopped and began clapping for these young unsung heroes who are putting their lives on the line everyday for us so we can go to school, work and home without fear of reprisal. When I saw the soldiers being applauded and cheered for, it hit me. I'm not alone. I'm not the only red-blooded American who still loves this country and supports our troops and their families

Just when I thought I could not be more proud of my country or of our service men and women, a young girl, not more than 6 or 7 years old, ran up to one of the male soldiers. He didn't look any more than 22 years old as he knelt down and said "Hi."

The little girl then asked him if he would give something to her daddy for her. The young soldier asked her what she wanted him to give to her Daddy when the little girl grabbed the neck of this soldier, gave him the biggest hug she could muster and then kissed him on the cheek.

The mother of the little girl said her daughter's name was Courtney and told the young soldier that her husband was a Marine and had been in Iraq for 11 months. As the mom was explaining how much her daughter missed her father, the young soldier began to tear up.

After this mom had finished explaining her situation, all of the soldiers huddled together for a brief sec-

ond. One of the servicemen pulled out a military-looking walkie-talkie and started talking back and forth on it. About 10-15 seconds later, the young soldier walked back over to Courtney, bent down and said "I spoke to your daddy and he told me to give this to you."

He hugged this little girl that he had just met and gave her a kiss on the cheek. "Your daddy told me to tell you that he loves you more than anything and he is coming home very soon."


The mom at this point was crying almost uncontrollably. The young soldier stood to his feet at attention and saluted Courtney and her mom.

Chick-fil-A's positive impact

Remember last year when the ice storm hit the South? The mainstream media showed footage of miles of cars stranded on the frozen interstates. Several national news broadcasts that I saw reported about school kids trapped on busses for almost 24 hours because of all of the ice and parents going frantic wondering where their kids were.

In all of the icy gloom and doom, I bet you didn't hear about the heroic and generous actions of a Chick-fil-A along Highway 280 in Birmingham, Alabama, did you?

Mark Meadows, owner of a local Chick-fil-A franchise, closed early the day of the storm and sent all of his employees home. However, the employees and Meadows soon discovered that they were not going to be able to get home with all of the stranded motorists stuck on the roads. Some of the cars near the restaurant had been stranded for up to seven hours.

Audrey Pitt, manager of the Chick-fil-A, described the conditions:

"Our store is about a mile and a half from the interstate and it took me two hours to get there. It was a parking lot as far as I could see. At

one point there were more people walking than driving."

Meadows and his employees fired up the kitchen and began preparing chicken sandwiches as fast as they could. They prepared several hundred sandwiches and then Meadows and his staff headed out and began distributing the hot meals to the stranded motorists on both sides of Highway 280.

Some of the drivers tried to pay them for the sandwiches, but Meadows and his employees refused to take a single penny. Pitt explained why:

"This company is based on taking care of people and loving people before you're worried about money or profit. We were just trying to follow the model that we've all worked under for so long and the model that we've come to love. There was really nothing else we could have done but try to help people any way we could."

However, Meadows and Pitt were not through with their Good Samaritan efforts. They helped push cars off the roads, up inclines and whatever else they could do to help. Then they kept the restaurant open overnight so that stranded motorists

could have a warm place to be. A number of motorists slept in booths or on the benches.

The following morning, they again fired up the kitchen and prepared chicken biscuits for their overnight guests and once again they refused to accept any payment. During that 24 hour period, this Chick-fil-A restaurant opened their kitchen, their doors and their hearts to hundreds of stranded motorists and they did so refusing to accept any payment. As one source put it, Meadows and his staff lived up to the words Jesus spoke in Matthew 25:35 which states:

"For I was hungry, and you gave Me something to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave Me something to drink; I was a stranger, and you invited Me in..."

Their actions were truly generous and heroic as they also braved the frigid temperatures to hand out hun-

dreds of hot meals to complete strangers. And I bet you never heard anything about this from the mainstream media. It was too much against their liberal standards to report a Christian company doing something so positive for so many.

Maybe we can look for someone who is less fortunate than we are and do something nice for them.

Abandoned by Man, but not by God

Sometimes it seems as though life doesn't make sense. Circumstances and situations cause us to wonder about God's love for us. I was born in England and abandoned at the age of ten months by my grandfather because I was an illegitimate child. I was institutionalized for the first fifteen years of my life in orphanages. I remember being physically and sexually abused before I was twelve years old. I was hospitalized for while and then sent to a much larger institution.

When I reached the age of 15, the English government announced they were over populated with orphans after World War 2 and they were shipping us to other countries. The group I was in was shipped to Sydney, Australia. This was my first chance to see outside the wall of the orphanage. After traveling six weeks on the ship, we arrived and were lined up, separated and transported to different institutions.

My real Mother, now living in America, found out I was still alive when her father finally confessed that he had abandoned me when I was still an infant. She traced me to Australia and wanted to have me with her. She made arrangements and I was in the states with her within one year after receiving my first letter from her. One week after I arrived, her husband was found shot in the head and dead. She told my brothers and sisters that I had killed their father. She had convinced me I had gotten up in my sleep, not knowing what I was doing, and shot him without remembering any of it. This guilt stayed with me for years until God set me free from guilt for something I never did. This started my mother on the road to becoming an abusive alco-

holic. I was abused once again and put on the street at 17 where I wound up in a juvenile home. I suffered a nervous breakdown there, and was placed in a hospital for treatment.

By the time I was 26, I had been married twice and had three babies, the first one born with brain damage. I worked in a restaurant at night and began associating with the wrong crowd. Drinking and drugs soon took charge of my life. I became a bar waitress and dancer because the pay was better. My life was going from bad to worse. The American government discovered I was not an American citizen and wanted to send me back to England. My children would have to stay in America because they were American citizens by birth. It was during this time my real mother renewed contact with me and found out what was going on. She tried to find my real father as he was an American soldier stationed in England when their romance began.

My real father and I met for the first time in 1960. I was allowed to stay in America and I moved to Texas where he and his wife lived. I met my grandmother, my father's mother, for the first time. She gave me a book called "The New Testament" which she inscribed in the front, "To my Granddaughter." She told me to read a chapter every day and my life would get better. I cherished the book and began reading it every day as she had instructed. I never realized how much God truly loved me until I began reading His Word.

Since then, God has not only made himself real to me, He also allowed me to reunite with my whole family. He sent me a Christian husband and father for my children. We both worked in the

ministry. During the last two years we were together, challenges with both physical and mental health issues within our families began to appear. I was diagnosed with a blockage in my lower abdomen that the doctors thought was cancer because of the way it affected my body. Because the trials were so severe spiritually, emotionally and financially, my husband abandoned me

about a month before our twentieth anniversary.

I was in church one Sunday morning in 1998, when suddenly my heart stopped and I fell limp on the floor. I was lifeless when the paramedics carried me off to the hospital. God miraculously raised me from the dead, not only physically, but spiritually too. This was not the end of my life, but a new opportunity from God. What we perceive to be our disappointments are God's opportunities for our lives, if we just trust Him. He is my maker, husband, lawyer, councilor and my great physician. He can use anyone for His glory if we only allow Him to work through us.

Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will direct your paths..

Lemonade Cake with Lemon Cream Cheese Frosting

- Cake**
- 1 Lemon boxed cake mix (I used Duncan Hines)
 - 4 eggs
 - 1¼ cup milk
 - ½ cup vegetable oil
 - 2 Tbsp Lemonade from concentrate
- Glaze:**
- 2 Tbsp Lemonade from concentrate
 - 1 cup powdered sugar
 - 1 Tbsp water
- Frosting:**
- 8 oz block ½ less fat cream cheese
 - ½ cup room temp butter (1 stick)
 - 3 Tbsp Lemonade from concentrate
 - ½ teaspoon vanilla
 - 5½ cups powdered sugar
1. Preheat oven to 350°
 2. Spray 2 8" round cake pans generously with cooking/baking spray.
 3. In mixer beat all your ingredients on low for 30 seconds and then on medium for 2 minutes.
 4. Keep the remaining frozen lemonade concentrate in the freezer...you will need it again.
 5. Bake according to package directions (I baked for approx 30 minutes) until cake is set and toothpick comes out clean.
 6. Let the cakes cool in pan...about an hour. Do not remove.
 7. When the cakes are cooled level them off so they are flat on top.
 8. Poke holes in cake that wasn't cut using a fork.
 9. Next make your glaze: in a medium bowl combine powdered sugar, lemonade and water.
 10. Stir until smooth.
 11. Pour equally over the top of the cakes..still in the cake pans.
 12. Cover and let sit for at least an hour, but overnight is best in refrigerator.
 13. For frosting cream butter and cream cheese together until combined.
 14. With mixer on low add your lemonade and vanilla.
 15. Slowly add in your powdered sugar and then beat on medium for 1-2 minutes until smooth.
 16. When ready to frost remove your cakes from the refrigerator.
 17. Loosen cake around the edges with a butter knife so they will release easily.
 18. Frost as desired.
